Supervisor Brochey,

Thank you for the information you provided in response to my letter dated December 5, 2014 requesting information about how the town has used the benefits from the relicensing settlement agreement for the Niagara Power Project. I appreciate your time and feedback.

After reviewing your letter I had a few questions that I hope you can address. I understand that the data precedes your time as Supervisor, but the statute directs NYPA to provide certain information and I am hoping you can help us.

Your letter indicates how the power allocation will be used in the future, and I realize this has been a topic of discussion recently with NYPA, but we need to know what the benefit has been since the allocation began in September 2007. For example, my understanding is that for the first few years the town distributed the allocation to its residents, so identifying the total discount provided annually to all residents would be the number that would address this item.

You also mentioned how the Host Community Funds have been distributed but it appears the information only covers approximately one year. Again, we are looking for information since the payments began in 2007.

Lastly, we would like to know how the town has used its Greenway Funds since 2007.

The law requires NYPA to request the use of the funds and asks the benefitting entity to identify if any jobs were created or retained as a result of the power allocation or funding.

Your time and feedback are greatly appreciated. If you have any questions or would like to discuss this please do not hesitate to contact me.
